- **Decatur Cooperative Ministry** Family Transitional housing program provides housing and support services to move families from homelessness to self-reliance in 6 to 24 months. The program, often called "Family House," uses single-family houses and apartments throughout DeKalb County. Both single- and two-parent families can apply, and hard-to-place families, including those headed by single fathers or with teenage boys, are welcome. Hagar's House Emergency Shelter is an emergency night shelter with support services for women with children. The shelter offers at least 30 nights of short-term housing and has room for up to 30 guests.


