

**Element 2: More than 10 percent of patients have electronic access to their current health information (including lab results, problem list, medication lists, and allergies) within four business days of when the information is available to the practice**

This is a core Meaningful Use measure reported as “Electronic Access” in the “Meaningful Use Measures” report within PCC EHR. You will need to run this MU report separately for each provider then add them together to achieve a practice-wide result.

PCC EHR practices that have been registered to use PCC's patient portal functionality, My Kid's Chart, have the ability to give patients portal access. All patients with portal access will automatically qualify in the numerator for this measure if they were seen by the selected provider in the reporting period used. Information including lab results, problem list, medication lists, and allergies are all available in the portal immediately after the visit has been completed.

PCC's portal solution is designed to be immediately accessible using the patient's smartphone. For pediatricians, our primary customers, smartphone access from the checkout window improves portal adoption considerably.
